Review of Noise Management Plan (NMP), Version 4 dated January 2023.

Thank you for submitting version 4 of the NMP requested under permit condition 3.4 This was received on 22 February 2023 and has now been assessed.

We confirm that we are partially approving the NMP on the terms set out below. We are satisfied your NMP identifies and sets appropriate measures to minimise the risks of pollution from noise during the normal operating hours set out on page 1 of the NMP. The NMP states that the normal operating hours are between 8am to 5pm Monday – Friday and 8am to 4pm on Saturdays, with the site closed on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

The NMP also states that 'on rare occasions, there may be a need to work outside of our normal operating hours, such as when there is a breakdown of machinery'. The NMP relates to the assessment of noise during normal working hours and conditions only. Our approval of the NMP therefore relates only to operation within the normal operating hours set out on page 1 of the NMP. If we attend outside of these hours and substantiate noise pollution, this may be a breach of Permit condition 3.4.1.

The NMP (V4) no longer has an entry for noise and noise mitigation from the use of a granulator as this has been decommissioned by yourselves as confirmed in your email of 22/02/2023.

Continued regulation:

As you are aware, your Regulated Facility has been the subject of ongoing noise complaints. We will continue to monitor compliance with Permit Condition 3.4 relating to noise. Our ongoing regulation may result in breaches of the Permit and enforcement action. It could also result in us requiring a review of the NMP. If we attend and substantiate noise pollution and confirm that appropriate measures have not been used to prevent or minimise noise pollution, this would be a breach of Permit Condition 3.4.1. Appropriate measures include those specified in the NMP.

<u>Implementation of NMP</u>: Now that we have approved the updated NMP (version 4) you should implement it straightaway. The NMP should be reviewed by yourselves on a yearly basis to ensure it remains current.

Action:

Confirm the destination of cables and wires that would otherwise been processed by the granulator. Forward supporting paperwork to **Ebunoluwa.Bilankulu@environment-agency.gov.uk** by **10th March 2023**.
